Communication skills

At the end of this teaching, the student will be able to:

- Know how to communicate using the correct scientific terminology to describe wellness and illness, the nursing assessment and care plan, the principles of asepsis, disinfection, hand hygiene, the Personal Protective Equipment, the patient mobilization, hygiene, elimination, nutrition, rest and comfort, the pressure ulcers and the vital signs.
- to identify areas of interest for nursing and to describe the processes of critical thinking and effective communication
- to describe the nursing profession, ethics, values and responsibilities of the nurse, also referring to the deontological code and professional profile

Making judgements

- Knowing how to choose the appropriate and correct methods for patient elimination
- Knowing how to choose the appropriate and correct methods for patient rest and comfort

COURSE STRUCTURE

The module of Clinical Nursing will be in English with Lectures/discussions (28 hours), student presentations, audiovisual, written assignments, assigned readings (texts, journals, electronic).

The module of General Nursing will be in English and is structured in 14 hours of frontal teaching, divided into lessons of 2 or 4 hours according to the academic calendar. Lectures/discussions, student presentations, audiovisual, written assignments, assigned readings (texts, journals, electronic).

The module of Professional Organization will be in English and is structured in 28 hours of frontal teaching, divided into lessons of 2 or 4 hours according to the academic calendar.

COURSE GRADE DETERMINATION
