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PREREQUISITES

No specific prerequisites are required.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

For student elective activities, we mean activities organized to ensure cultural and disciplinary expansion, optimizing individual preparation and training, and responding to each student's personal inclinations. These activities are an integral part of the Nursing Degree Course as they are aimed at learning and deepening specific themes consistent with the educational path. By definition, they are activities designed autonomously by students with the aim of personalizing the curriculum. They may vary depending on the objectives of theoretical and/or practical deepening.

For activities carried out, where required, it is necessary for the student to request a certificate of participation.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Elective activities offer students a wide range of opportunities to develop knowledge, skills, and relevant abilities both for their academic journey and for their future career in nursing. Specifically, participation in these activities will allow the student to:

- Understand the structure and policies of the University, as well as the functioning of the Nursing Degree Course and its quality assurance procedures.
- Develop skills in organizing academic events such as Open Day, Welcome Day, and School-Work Alternation, improving planning, resource management, and activity coordination abilities.
- Enhance research skills by participating in research projects, which may include data collection and analysis, literature review, and presentation of results.
- Improve language skills through participation in English/Italian language courses, facilitating effective communication with colleagues and patients from different nationalities.

- Expand knowledge of clinical care areas through participation in UniCaMeetings, lectures by visiting professors, and InterProfessional Education Day (IPE day), providing a broader perspective on clinical practices and interprofessional collaboration.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The Nursing Degree Course allocates a total of 6 university educational credits (CFUs) for student elective activities in the second and third years of the course. Each CFU corresponds to 30 hours.

Attendance at seminar activities is mandatory for all students enrolled in the CdL.

The Course Council organizes and schedules the offering of student elective activities at the beginning of the academic year or, in any case, at the beginning of each teaching period, until the total of 6 CFUs is achieved.

However, students also have the opportunity to propose elective activities relevant to the objectives of the Degree Course. These activities, as a rule, should not overlap with scheduled educational activities and must be conducted in person.

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Student elective activities are subject to evaluation, which will be recorded in the student's academic record as either "eligible" or "not eligible," allowing the acquisition of 3 CFUs annually. All courses proposed by the Academic Management are valid for credit acquisition, while those initiated by students must be evaluated in advance by the Academic Management. The Academic Management will communicate to the student the possible eligibility of the attended activity. For the activity to be officially recognized, it is necessary to upload documentation attesting to actual participation.

OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES

Students will have the opportunity to engage in theoretical/practical exercises and participate in seminars or laboratory activities.
