# CALL FOR ADMISSIONS TO THE CPD SECOND-LEVEL COURSE IN IMPLANT DENTISTRY AT THE SAINT CAMILLUS INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH SCIENCES – UNICAMILLUS Academic Year 2024/2025

GIVEN the University's Code of Ethics and Organization, Management and Control Model no. 231;

**GIVEN** law no. 168 of 19<sup>th</sup> May 1989, concerning the establishment of the Ministry of University and Research (MUR);

**GIVEN** decree no. 270 of 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2004 "Amendments to the regulations concerning laws about the educational autonomy of universities", approved through the Decree of the Minister of University and Scientific and Technological Research no. 509 of 3<sup>rd</sup> November 1999;

## **HEREBY DECREES**

## Article no.1

Title	IMPLANT DENTISTRY
Objectives	The University Master Program (CPD Course) in Implant Dentistry (UMID) is designed for the general dentist who has already taken the first step into the field of implant dentistry. You have already placed implants and now want to develop your practical skills and build up solid scientific knowledge to provide safe, appropriate and efficient treatments.  The 18-month modular Master Program (CPD Course)'s programme takes into account your time constraints and job responsibilities. The teaching mode is blended: a blended teaching approach combining on-site lectures and live distance learning. During the course of your studies, you will
	be required to travel five times to university centres, where you will attend live lectures, practical classes and live surgeries and grow from the input of our international lecturers, guest lectures and fellow students.

- Literature review and application of evidence-based principles in clinical practice.

# Eligible students and admission requirements

In order to be admitted to the Master's Course, it is compulsory to hold at least one of the following degrees title:

- Master's Degree in "Dentistry and Dental Prosthesis" or other equivalent qualification class LM-46; EQF: 7.
- Master's Degree in "Medicine and Surgery" or other equivalent qualification class L M- 41; E QF: 7.

Candidates with a degree completed abroad comparable in duration and content to an Italian degree required for admission to a CPD course may also apply. If this is the case, candidates must provide a declaration of value issued by the Italian consular authority in the country of study (accompanied by a transcript of records and a copy of the final diploma), or a Certificate of Comparability/Statement of Correspondence (ARDI) issued by CIMEA (accessing the CIMEA platform) with an accompanying Verification Certificate, or a Diploma Supplement (for European degree titles) issued by the university of origin and legalized at the Italian Embassy in the country of study. Candidates who do not possess or do not present an eligible degree certificate within 6 months of enrolment, in accordance with current regulations, forfeit their enrolment, if already admitted, and are not entitled to any refund.

If the prescribed requirements are not met, the Teaching Services Office may, at any time and with a reasoned decision, exclude the candidate from the programme.

# Enrolment methods

Candidates who meet the requirements indicated must proceed with enrolment directly through the GOMP portal following information provided in the enrolment guide on the UniCamillus website.

To finalize the application, the following documentation must be provided and uploaded on to the portal during enrolment:

A) certification of the degree title or authenticated copy of the degree title, or, provisionally, self-certification. Candidates holding a degree completed abroad must present, under penalty of exclusion, the original official translation into Italian of the academic qualifications, complete with legalization and Declaration of Value issued by the Italian Embassy or Italian Consulate competent for the territory in the country where the degree was completed;

- B) photocopy of a valid identification document;
- C) photocopy of the health insurance card;
- D) digital passport photo (JPEG or PNG format);

E) privacy information in accordance with EU Regulation no.2016/679 on "the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data" available on the GOMP portal, to be uploaded during enrolment;

F) student contract available on the GOMP portal, to be uploaded during enrolment.

For candidates holding equivalent qualifications:

G) Declaration of Value issued by the Italian consular authority in the country of study (accompanied by a transcript of records + copy of the final diploma) or a CIMEA Comparability Statement accompanied by a CIMEA Verification Statement (accessing the CIMEA platform) or a Diploma Supplement (for European degree titles) issued by the University of origin and legalized at the Italian Embassy in the country of study.

Applicants who submit incomplete documentation are still admitted but cannot finalize enrolment until all the required documentation is presented.

Please note that enrolment will be considered completed only after payment of the first instalment and secretarial fees.

#### **Enrolment fees**

The enrolment fee for the course is € 11.500,00 plus € 50,00 for secretarial fees

Enrolment will be considered completed only after payment.

Failure to pay the fee within the established time limit will result in the suspension of access to the platform and the non-admission to the final exam. Discontinued attendance of the lectures does not in any way relieve the student from the obligation to pay the remaining fees.

RIGHT OF WITHDRAWAL - If enrolment has been completed remotely or outside of the University itself, students may exercise the right of withdrawal within 14 (fourteen) days from the date of enrolment (the payment date will be taken as reference), and, as a result, unilaterally withdraw by clearly communicating to UniCamillus their wish to withdraw. This request must be sent by CEM to the address <a href="mailto:postlaurea.unicamillus@pec.it">postlaurea.unicamillus@pec.it</a>. UniCamillus will proceed to reimburse the amount paid within the following 14 (fourteen) days, retaining an amount equal to 5% of the amount paid for secretarial services and using the same payment method used by the student, unless indicated otherwise.

Outside of the cases expressly provided for in this call for applications, no refund will be made under any circumstances.

RIGHT TO LEAVE THE COURSE - By exercising the right to leave the course, students will no longer be allowed access to lectures or tools made available to them by UniCamillus.

Students who wish to leave the course must submit a request through an online procedure by accessing the student portal (Gomp) with their credentials, by going to the "career>questions>request to leave the course" section.

In case of withdrawal, no amount already paid up to the time of submitting the request will be refunded under any circumstances.

Students wishing to leave the course after the start of lectures are still required to pay the full amount of fees, as prescribed.

# **Provisions**

Participation in this call for admissions implies full and unquestionable acceptance of the provisions contained therein, including the provisions contained in the "Student Contract" attached to this call, which is an integral part thereof.

For legal and interpretation purposes, the text of this call written in Italian, approved by a specific Rector's Decree, available from the Teaching Services Office, of which a certified copy can be obtained, shall prevail. For all information not contained in this document, reference is made to the Statute and Regulations that govern the functioning and activities of the University.
