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Prerequisites

It is important that the student is aware of the problems that can be presented physiologically both in the gynecological and obstetric fields, concerning the different phases of life.

Learning objectives

The fundamental educational objective of the teaching is the knowledge of the main complications related to the different phases of a woman's life, pregnancy and birth control.

Learning outcomes

Knowledge and ability to understand

At the end of this teaching course the student will need:

- Describe and manage obstetric gynecological care needs that require preventive and curative skills in specific ultra-specialist sectors such as alterations of the menstrual cycle
- Know the clinical manifestations related to the woman's sexual biological cycle
- Describe the physiological changes in pregnancy

- Describe the midwifery care in case of twin pregnancy

Ability to apply knowledge and understanding

At the end of the course the student will be able to:

- apply the principles of midwifery to selected cases, problems and a variable range of situations
- use the tools, methodologies language and conventions of midwifery to test and communicate ideas and explanations

Communication skills

At the end of the course the student must be able to use the appropriate scientific and clinical terminology.

Autonomy of judgment

At the end of the course the student must be able to correctly diagnose the pathologies treated.

Teaching method

The teaching is structured in 14 hours of frontal teaching, divided into cycles of lessons of 2-3-4 hours, based on the academic calendar. Lectures will

include theoretical lessons and supplementary seminars on the topics treated.

Learning assessment method

The verification of the students' preparation will take place through an oral exam, in which the student's ability to obtain the required knowledge will be assessed, in accordance with the objectives and the teaching program. In addition, autonomy of judgment, communication skills and the student's ability to learn will be evaluated.

Support activity

In addition to the teaching activity, the student will be given the opportunity to participate in seminars, research internships and monographic courses.
